Re: Notice of Erratum - Sustainable Forest Management Plan for the Fort St. John Pilot.

An amendment of an administrative nature to the sustainable forest management plan is required to provide clarification for the requirements of the Forest Operations Schedule.

Specifically, the last paragraph on page 266 of the March 15, 2004 version states:

"The FOS will continue to identify road deactivation operations that have been or are to be conducted by the participants. It is proposed to remove the requirements of Section 81(1)(g)(i) to (iv) and incorporate the following approach:

 All roads that have been deactivated by a participant will be shown on the appropriate map."

The first sentence incorrectly included "...or are to be...".

With the approval of the SFMP, the FOS requirements were revised by removing the requirements of Section 81(1)(g)(i) to (iv) and requiring that all roads that have been deactivated by a participant will be shown on the appropriate map. The last paragraph on page 266 should be:

"The FOS will continue to identify road deactivation operations that have been conducted by the participants. It is proposed to remove the requirements of Section 81(1)(g)(i) to (iv) and incorporate the following approach:

 All roads that have been deactivated by a participant will be shown on the appropriate map."

The presence of multiple forestry and petroleum resource companies operating on the same landbase often results in frequent changes to deactivation plans. Therefore stating with any certainty, which roads are to be deactivated within a predetermined future time period, is very

difficult. Removing the requirement to display these on the maps is more operationally feasible, and is generally consistent with the current Operational and Site Planning Regulation.
